Early (1848 & 1850) Voters Lists for Hierschau, Molotschna Colony

Hierschau in the Molotschna Colony was founded in 1848. Therefore its household heads are not included in the 1847 Molotschna Colony voters list transcribed by Tim Janzen (see http://www.mennonitegenealogy.com/russia/1847_Molotschna.htm). Fortunately we have access to two voter lists, one for 1848 and another for 1850. These are tabulated below with the Feuerstelle number given in the first column. Note that the first village Schultz (mayor) and Beisitzer (deputy mayor) were elected when only 23 of the 30 Feuerstelle were occupied. This is in agreement with Huebert (page 43), who used brick requisitions to suggest that the village originally had 23 farmsteads. Two years later, when an election for colony Beisitzer was held, all 30 farms were occupied. It appears that the last 7 settlers moved to Hierschau in 1849 since notes added to their entries in the 1835 Molotschna Colony Census state that these 7 people transferred to Hierschau in 1849 whereas the corresponding notes in the census for the first 23 settlers say that they transferred to Hierschau in 1848. Included in the tabulation is a column showing the original settlers based on the map on page 47 of Huebert's book.

We have highlighted any significant differences between the information found in the voters lists and Huebert's list of the original settlers in gray. As one can see, Huebert was very close to the truth in his assessment of who the first settlers were. The Andreas Pankratz found in Huebert's list may have been Andreas Pankratz (b. 1848, Grandma #346871), who was a son of Jacob Pankratz (b. 1821, Grandma #302985) and the Tobias Konkel (Kunkel) found in Huebert's list may have been Tobias Kunkel (b. 1842, Grandma #31570), who was a son of Friedrich Konkel. Jacob Pankratz at Feuerstelle #7 and Friedrich Konkel (Kunkel) were likely from either Waldheim or Gnadenfeld, two villages that were founded after the 1835 Molotschna Colony Census was compiled. The origin and identity of Mr. Heidebrecht are still unknown. He may have been a misrepresentation of Jacob Rogalsky. The origin and identity of Peter von Riesen (Friesen) are also still unknown. Included in the table is a column with the village of origin (all in the Molotschna Colony) and columns with the birth date (if known) and Grandma database number for each household head.
