Hamberg, Molotschna Households: 1861 and 1913

Page 8 of the <u>July 16, 1913</u> issue of *Die Mennonitische Rundschau* contains a letter from Abraham A. Heidebrecht of Hamberg in which he goes through each Wirtschaft (65 dissjatine [about 175 acres] farmstead) belonging to the village of Hierschau. In this letter he names the first owner from when the village was settled (in 1863 according to GAMEO) and the owner in 1913. In some cases, he says something about each owner. This was followed by a letter in the <u>Dec. 31, 1913</u> issue from Leander Janz of Mount View Oklahoma, a former resident posing questions and making comments about several of the families. These comments contain important genealogical information, not readily available elsewhere or found in the current version of the GRANDMA database. They also contain bits of family history which are of interest.

I have tabulated this information and added a list of those households which had children in school during the 1861-62 school year. The school list contains the property numbers for those with children in 1861-62. These can be directly compared with the list by Heidebrecht. An interesting point is the appearance of a school list at least a year before the village was founded.

This list can be compared to the <u>1875-76 school list</u> and the <u>1916 list of landowners</u> in the village. These two lists unfortunately do not provide property numbers. See also the page for Hamberg <u>here</u>. A map of the properties in Hamberg for the approximate period 1928-39 can be found on page 44 of <u>Molotschna Historical</u> Atlas by Helmut T. Huebert | Open Library.

Note that I have compiled a similar listing for the village of <u>Hierschau</u>.

I have not included numbers for these people in the <u>GRANDMA</u> database. Connecting these people to those already in the database requires some careful research. This must be done and the results incorporated in the database before adding numbers.

My comments are in [square brackets].
