The year 1818 saw dramatic developments for the Hutterites in Russia. The community split aproximately in half. One half wanting to keep the old traditions and communal living, the other half wanting to have private property and join the Mennonites. This is described on pages 614 to 631 of the English translation of the Hutterian Chronicles. There is also copious Russian government documentation on this situation as found in the archives in St. Petersburg, Russia (RGIA) and the archives of the Guardianship Committee for Foreign Settlers in Odessa.
