Waldheim's Original Settlers

- 1. Correlating four independent lists enables us to identify Waldheim's original settlers and when they began residing in the village.
- 2. We begin with the 1839 spring planting record (Penner 1 below and in the chart at the end of this file; middle names added when possible from other records). The planting record includes 21 numbered names and an additional 15 unnumbered names.
 - 2.1. We should not expect the list to provide a comprehensive record of who was residing in the village in spring 1839, since the list is not a census but a record of who planted what quantities of potatoes and flax.
 - 2.2. Nevertheless, the presence of 21 numbered names is significant, since this number equals the total of 1838–1839 settlers from other sources: 8 for 1838 (or the first year of settlement) and 13 for 1839.
- 3. Placing the names from the 1839 list of settlers (Fast 1) alongside the 1839 planting record reveals an exact correlation for 13 of the names.
 - 3.1. The agreement confirms the accuracy of the 1839 settlers list, since the assignment of a number presumably indicates that a *Wirtschaft* had been or soon would be assigned to each of these settlers.
 - 3.2. The 8 names that do not appear on the 1839 settlers list but who have a number assigned in the 1839 planting list are no doubt those who were assigned a *Wirtschaft* the prior year: these are Waldheim's original 8 settlers.
- 4. On the basis of these two lists, we can reasonably conclude thus far that the 21 numbered names on the 1839 planting list include Waldheim's first 8 settlers and the 13 settlers who followed in 1839. However, we must now explain why the 1839 planting list also has 15 unnumbered names after the 21 numbered names.
 - 4.1. None of the 15 unnumbered names appears on the 1839 list. However, 13 of the 15 appear on the 1840 list of settlers (Fast 2).
 - 4.2. The most reasonable explanation for their presence on the 1839 planting list and the 1840 settlers list is that these 13 persons were in Waldheim already in early 1839 but were not eligible to become settlers until 1840.
 - 4.3. This is certainly the case for those who were living with landed family (Benjamin Buller Jr., Johan Wedel, Heinrich Wedel), as reported in the 1840 settler list. It thus seems likely that the same was true for those not known to be living with landed family.
 - 4.4. The 2 names on the 1839 planting list but missing from the 1840 settler list (4.1) are Cornelius Wedel (the fourth person with this name listed), who apparently became eligible to become a settler the following year, in 1841; and Benjamin Voth, whose name appears nowhere other than on the 1839 planting list; at present we have no evidence that he ever became a Waldheim settler.

- 5. Five names appear on the later lists but are not on the 1839 planting list. In all likelihood, each of these individuals did not arrive in Waldheim in time to plant crops in spring 1839. Four (Jacob Buller, Benjamin Unruh, Martin Bayer, Andreas Schmidt) seem to have settled in Waldheim in 1840, while the fifth (Tobias Schultz) settled in 1841
- 6. The Braun Archive list of Mennonites assigned *Wirtschaften* 1839–1841 (Penner 2) corresponds generally to the other lists of names, although its assignment of settlement years frequently deviates from the others.
 - 6.1. The Penner 2 list lacks two names from the 1840 settlers list (Benjamin Unruh, Andreas Schmidt.
 - 6.2. The Penner 2 list confirms that Tobias Schultz was an 1841 settler.
- 7. Taken all together, the evidence of the lists can be arranged into a coherent picture of Waldheim's original settlers, with only one stray thread (Benjamin Voth). The settlers by year were:
